

Praying with your PARTNERSHIP



God is why we do what we do. He is central to NET's mission, and that includes partnership. We entrust all our efforts to Him, and we trust in His providence. So before you read any further in this manual, stop and pray.

At every point throughout your partnership journey, pray. When you are building a list of potential partners, ask for the Holy Spirit to be with you. As you prepare to meet with or write a letter to a potential partner, ask the Holy Spirit to be with them. When you celebrate a donation, give God thanks for His goodness and the generosity of your new partner. This journey is in His hands, so trust in His power and goodness.

With that, I want to introduce you to a man called Ted Andrew. Ted served with NET Ministries from 2015 - 2019. While serving as the partnership coordinator, in April of 2019, Ted passed away from cancer. I invite you in a particular way to ask for his intercession as you make this journey of support raising for this coming year.

Partnership Goals:

Your partnership goal this year is divided into multiple categories. Each **EU or UK NET Missionary** is asked to raise **€5,250**, and each **International NET Missionary** is asked to raise **€7,000**. The reason for the difference in the minimum goal is due to differences in medical insurance and cultural differences that might affect fundraising ability. This is considered your initial goal and is based on a portion of the cost it takes to train and take care of a NET Missionary for a year. The actual cost of training and fielding a NET Missionary is **€17,000**.

In serving with NET Ministries Ireland this year, you are committing to raise your Partnership Goal in full. We highly encourage you to achieve this before your arrival at NET Training. NET Merchandise will be rewarded to those who raise their Bronze level goal before arriving at training. In rare circumstances, NET Missionaries may not be able to reach their Partnership Goal before arriving to training and will be required to continue to fundraise while in active ministry. This however, can be very difficult to do. **Please do all you can to raise your Partnership Goal before your arrival to NET Training.**

As stated above, this amount will cover only part of the cost of your training and living expenses throughout the year— with this in mind, we invite you pray about and to consider setting a personal goal of up to €17,000.

Reaching your goal by arrival:

As mentioned earlier, due to the business of a year on Net we strongly urge you to reach your goal by the time you come for NET training. When you reach your goal by arrival you will receive a €100 bonus and quarter zip. **This can only be received by those who reach their goal by the time they arrive for training!**

If you have any concerns or questions about the Partnership Goals, please do not hesitate to contact myself. Remember, partnership is about inviting others to join with you in the mission! **And if It's God's Will, It's God's Bill!**

Partnership Targets

Partnership is an important part of our ministry. Therefore, each NET Missionaries is as to commit to reaching Bronze Level by the start of training. As mentioned previously, we strongly encourage you raise your partnership before arriving at training. Contacting new partners while on NET can be difficult due to the business of a year on NET. Here are sample targets you might set in order to achieve this:

Deposit


The deposit of €300 required to secure your place on the 20/21 NET year, as referred to in the interview and application process, will be credited to your partnership total. Please ensure prompt payment of this deposit.

Stipend



Each month you will receive a stipend of €100. Your partnership will directly fund your stipend. Upon arrival, if you have not reached your Minimum Partnership Goal, your stipend will be reduced €5 for every €500 you are short of your Minimum. Once you reach your Minimum Partnership Goal, you will receive back-payments for the amounts withheld on previous stipends as part of that present months stipend.

Partnership Rewards

In addition to the above figures and commitments, NET Ministries Ireland has a reward system in place with the hope of recognizing the hard-work that our NET Missionaries do in building Partnership. **These rewards will be gifted to those who meet these amounts before the end of their NET year only.**

Again, these rewards are separated into the two categories listed above: EU/UK and International:



How your partners can DONATE:

Cash Donations:

Some of your partners may wish to partner with you by cash—be it a relative handing you €20 or a bucketful of coins and notes collected after a Sunday Mass in your parish church. It's very important that, where possible, **you get the name, address, and e-mail address of these partners**. You can use one of the Pledge Cards we have included in your partnership pack, or you can even jot them down and transfer them onto a Pledge Card later. This is important as your partners are *partnering* with you on this mission, and we want to keep them updated!

Please do NOT send cash donations in the post. Here are a few ways you can send this money to us.

- Deposit money into your bank account and make a donation online directly at netministries.ie/donate. **This is the preferred method, as there are fewer additional charges involved.**
- Deposit money into your bank account and write a cheque out to NET Ministries Ireland and send the cheque directly to the office. **This is not the preferred method as there are significant additional charges involved.**

***make sure to send in appropriate pledge cards. Specify online who the money is from.*



Cheque:



Many partners will prefer to write a cheque. This is the most common means of donating for those who will receive a letter from you. Here is some information your partners will need to know:

- All cheques should be out to **NET Ministries Ireland**.
- Please include a your partners' contact information, including their name, address, email, and phone number .
- Cheques can be posted directly to our office.

****Please note that cheques will incur significant bank related charges and therefore are not a preferred method of donation.***

Where possible, please encourage your partners to use other methods.

Website:

Partners with credit or debit cards often consider it easiest to donate through the website. **Please note: for all international partners, this option is preferred to cheques, as there are fewer additional charges involved.**

Donating through the website is a simple process, and can be done at www.netministries.ie/donate. Here are a few must-knows:

- Have your partners select *21/22 Missionaries*. Then select your name from the drop down menu.
- If your name does not appear in the drop down selection, your partner can select *General Donation*. **Ask them to write your name in the comments section.**
- All donations made through the website are made in Euro.
- **Please request that your partners to include their email when making an online donation.*



Credit, Debit & Pledge Cards:



For partners who have a debit or credit card but do not wish to donate through the website, there is the option of filling out the credit and debit card section of the Pledge Card. Once received in the office, we will process the card details.

**Please note: Donors must sign the bottom of the pledge card in order to authorize the transaction.*

***All donations will be withdrawn in the Euro amount.*

Other methods...

There are, of course, many ways in which a partner can donate—but the above are the most common. Past NET Missionaries have made use of websites such as GoFundMe, and many have had success with the Facebook fundraising option. Another option is that of Electronic Funds Transfers (EFT). Please contact the office for bank account information if you would like to use this method.

Your Partner's Guarantee:

- *Automatic withdrawals are secure.*
- *NET Ministries does NOT give out your partner's information.*
- *Monthly gifts can be adjusted or cancelled at any time by contacting NET Ministries of Ireland.*

Types of DONATIONS:

Monthly Donations:

Try and find as many monthly supporters as possible!

Monthly Supporters are very important to NET. Small gifts given on a monthly basis make a big difference. Many people cannot give one big sum of money at once but are willing to give monthly amounts that will automatically be taken from their bank account.

Monthly gifts allow for NET to budget and financially plan for the future because we are certain of the donations that are coming in.

** Monthly donations will continue to be withdrawn from accounts until the thanksgiving mass. If a donor would like to specify an end date to their monthly gifts, different than this date, please indicate that on their pledge card or contact the office.*

One-Time Donations:

Some people prefer to give a one-time donation. While not the preferred method, we will accept one-time donations also.



PLEDGE CARDS

When you receive a donation, we want to know who your new partner is so we can keep them up to date with the mission. Pledge Cards are a simple way for us to keep track of partners. Each Pledge Card has a space to write the name, address, phone and email address of your partner, followed by a step-by-step donation process. If your partner wishes to provide their credit or debit card information, please ensure that they sign the card, as this grants us permission to process the transaction. We request that your partner include their email address on the pledge so that we can easily send them updates throughout the year.

Please enclose a pledge card with each letter you send, or if you are holding a parish collection, bring some along with you. It's good to always carry pledge cards with you during fundraising events - you never know who might express an interest!

The STEPS of PARTNERSHIP:

The Steps of Partnership is a simple method which has been successful for many NET Missionaries in the past. It is important to remember that while you have committed to raising a goal of €5,250/€7,000, the most important thing is sharing your faith. By simply sharing a little bit of your story, and informing people of what you'll be doing as a missionary with NET, you will indeed give hope and receive support in prayers and funds from those who partner with you.

STEP 1: PRAY

First, commit your Partnership and your year with NET to God. Before you send a letter, speak to someone about NET or do anything regarding your Partnership... PRAY!

STEP 2: MAKE THE LIST

Grab a cup of tea, pray and then make a list of all the people who you can think of: Family, friends, people from church, businesses, your Bishop etc. Who should you put on the list? Anyone and everyone.

Don't leave someone out because you don't think they'll give – **YOU WILL** be surprised. Keep that list handy for a couple of days; when you think of someone – write their name down.



STEP 3: FIND CONTACT INFORMATION

The next step is to compile contact/ mailing information for your the people on your list. You should use the Excel Tracking Sheet that NET sent you. With this document, you can keep track of:

- a) Who you want to send letters to/who you want to appeal to.
- b) Donations you know have been sent in to NET Ministries Ireland.
- c) Donations which you have received personally and have forwarded on to the NET Ministries office.

It is important that you keep track of the name, date, and amount of any sponsors you know have donated on your behalf so that if later there is a mix up and a partner does not show up on your reports, it is easy to track it down and correct the mistake.

STEP 4: SHARE & ASK

It is important to remember that Partnership is a journey - and that journey is with real people. Partners want to know about you, and about what you will be doing during your time with NET Ministries of Ireland. This is why we use a Share & Ask method. However, how you share with people depends on who it is you wish to share with. I will be sending you information about how to share and ask you partners. The ask is important. Dream big and ask big, remember this is an opportunity to invite to join the mission, Jesus wants to use you invite others into the mission.

Letter

- If you want to write to someone, you should go have a look at Appendix 2.
- Include a pledge card with your letter.
- Inform your potential partner that you will be contacting them soon to share more about the mission with them.
- Make sure to include your contact information and the NET website, either in a footer or at the end of your letter.

Personal Meeting

- It is vital that you set up a personal meeting if it all possible with your the potential partner. On some occasions it may be necessary to contact your partner via skype, however the preferred way is by meeting in person.
- This makes the Share & Ask more personal. This meeting allows potential supporters to speak with you and ask you questions. Be Brave! **This is often where the greatest fruit comes from.**

We'll spend a good deal of time speaking about how to share about the mission and invite your partner to join your support team.

TIPS:

- Use the person's name often.
- Let them talk.
- Sit with confidence.
Shoulders back, sitting up straight, chin up.
- Use hand and body gestures **intentionally**.
When on zoom, say hello and **wave your hand**.
- Use a moderate tone
Not high like you are asking a question when you say hello.
- Hand and body gestures speak 70% more than what you are saying.
If your body believes what you are saying your words will too.
No more fidgeting.
- Be prepared for their questions.

*The purpose of this question is to find where **their passion meets your mission.***

So (name), I'd just like to begin by asking **who is Jesus to you?**

(3 minutes) Transition to testimony and Testimony:

The purpose is to connect their relationship with Jesus to yours and express the commonalities between you two. Then share how your shared experiences have brought you to come to NET. Your experience can also guide them to make the decision to come on board also.

(Example: They say: "Jesus is my rock." You can respond, "Jesus is my rock also, I first encounter him at a retreat. I was invited to attend a retreat when I was 14. I was excited for the travels and curious why my sister was so happy following Jesus so I decided to go. I encountered Jesus' love in a personal way that night and continued to follow Jesus after that. As time went on I realized that by following Jesus, I accomplished things beyond the realm of what I had even thought was possible. I ended up going to my dream college across the country and achieved a high gpa. After that I felt called to become a missionary, I had always wanted to travel and now Jesus gave me the opportunity to do so. I realize now that he united my desire to travel with my passion for giving other young people the opportunity to realize that they can do things beyond what they even think is possible if they do it with God. I hope that this yea on NET, many young people meet God, discover that He is our rock and steady foundation from which we will accomplish great things.)

Testimony ideas: Bullet point testimony/calling:

Example:

Finishing high school, oh what to do?

Well, I ought to serve Jesus.

Maybe NET?

Friend gives me the application form.

Slowly desires more and more to do NET.

Jesus did his thing, and now here I am!

Do you feel like you've ever encountered Jesus?

Convey gratitude for their willingness to share and share your goal for this year (to invite young people to love Jesus and embrace the life of the church) otherwise inform them of your goal this year.

Eg: "That's beautiful! Thank you for sharing! This year on NET we want to give other young people an opportunity to encounter Jesus as well."

Connection Question 2:

The purpose of the second question is to further engage them, you've just shared your testimony, it's important that you get to know you mission partner and enable them to discover where their passions and your mission align. Get them talking!

I'm really looking forward to serving on NET this year and as we continue, I'd like to ask what comes to mind when you think of young people in the Church today?

(1-2 minutes) Compelling Need and Vision:

Now that you understand what they're passionate about and their vision, it's time to share how NET aligns with their vision.

Example transition: In Ireland, there are many young people leaving the church. It is estimated that by 2050 the largest religion will be "no religion."

These statistics leave many Irish Catholics feeling hopeless because young people are leaving the Church. In NET we make missionaries of young and old, changing lives forever.

Facts about the Church in Ireland:

- i. 1995—2018: divorce legalized, same-sex marriage legalized, abortion legalized
- ii. Lowest number of men for the priesthood since 1795.
- iii. It is estimated that by 2050 the largest religion will be "no religion."

Compelling Call:

Here in NET, 'We encourage young people to love Jesus and embrace the life of the Church.'

(2 minutes) Ministry Outlook:

Explain what you will be doing as a NET missionary.

"Although I don't know which team I will be on, I will be doing ministry through encounter and discipleship and through the Lighthouse Effect.

(Choose some aspects of ministry that excite you and speak about those)

Encounter Ministry: Encounter and retreat days in schools which, youth groups, Surf Sand Sun Retreats, parish missions and more which invite young people from all walks of life to have a personal Encounter with Jesus.

Discipleship Ministry: Journeying with young people toward heaven through small groups meetings, meeting up for meals and activities, bible studies, and other faith sharing events. I have the opportunity to walk with Jesus' disciples.

The Lighthouse Effect: by reaching partners, assisting at regional and national ministry events, staying at host homes, and participating in local parish events, NET Missionaries create a lighthouse effect whereby the missionaries bring faith, hope, love, and life to the people of Ireland.

(2-3 Minutes) Share a story:

Share the story of a changed life.

(1 minute) My Commitment to you:

This is what I will be doing with NET, if you join me, I will look forward to sharing the glory stories that you and I will create together. In addition, on NET Missionaries have one hour of personal time each day and I will keep you in my prayers.

(2 Minutes) Ask:

"NET is a non-profit mission/organization, and I have the opportunity to ask others such as yourself, to join me in the mission. Today I would like to ask you to join the mission and my support team, at _____ amount per month?"

Wait for their response.

(? minutes) Questions:

Do you have any questions about what I'll be doing with NET this year?

(3 minutes) If yes: Thank and share the ways to donate with them. Inform them that you can help them with an online donation if that is what they choose and ask if they would like to set up their donation right now as you can walk them through the process.

Show 70% of your excitement, 100% will scare them.

Thank you very much and I look forward to having you on my team! Would you be willing to sign up online? This way donations can automated be taken (word change) from you account each month.

“Yes that’s fine” Great, I can actually help you sign up right now if you’re ready?

If they’d prefer to sign up when they return home – Here’s my card, all you have to do it type in the address you see here and it will bring you straight to my page.

“No, I’d prefer a cash/check donation.” That’s just fine, cheque donations can be written to NET Ministries Ireland with my name in the notes section.

Thank you and again and I look forward to keeping you in my prayers throughout the year. God Bless!

I have to think about it: No problem, I would be happy to call you back in three days or so after you’ve have to time to think/pray/talk if over with your spouse.

No: Would a different amount suit you better.

Ultimately a No: Thank you for your time, it is a privilege to share the mission with you. God Bless you!

Ask if they know of anyone else who’d be interested in joining the mission.

Thank You: Thank them for their time and support.



Large/Small Group Presentation/ Parish Appeals

There are times you will be asked to give a group presentation. This can be to the local Knights of Columbus or St. Columbanus group, or even to the entire parish during an appeal. Here are some tips:

1. Dress appropriately. Make sure your clothes are clean and neat!
2. Speak slowly, clearly and don’t ramble - be concise, and prepare what you want to say before you go.
3. Make eye contact and try not to read everything off the page - this will make it much more personal.

4. Share personally, not just facts, but share where you have come from and how you decided to embark on a year of mission with NET Ministries Ireland.
5. Use visuals - this will help people concentrate on what you're saying.
6. At the end, distribute promotional material that can be taken home - this includes pledge cards and brochures!

Follow-up: If you haven't received a donation from a prospective partner, always follow-up with a phone call. They may have forgotten, or simply need to ask you a few more questions! Our suggestion is that you follow-up with your partner three times if they have not responded.

- Ask them if they have received your letter.
- Inquire whether they have any questions, or wish to partner with you in this mission.
- Whether they join your support team or not, yes thank them for their time.

Track Donation

- Remember to record the donation on your tracking form. Keep this updated. The tracking form is for your use; but may be used if donations are missing from your official partnership report.

STEP 5: SEND A THANK YOU

Try to send a thank you within **24 hours** of receiving the donation. This will help to keep you organized and let your supporters know that their support is important to you. Some supporters may send donations directly to the NET office. We will try send you updates throughout your fundraising - be sure to check it for new donors and send them a thank



THANKING YOUR PARTNERS:



The importance of Thank You:

It is crucial that you thank your partners who have supported you. Please send a thank you note to all your partners as soon as is possible. We will work hard to ensure you receive regular partnership updates to facilitate this process. Please thank all of your partners before you arrive at training.

We ask that through the year you send monthly updates to your partners. This can be in the form of a video or newsletter. Having your partners' email address will enable you send them updates throughout the year.

What updates will my supporters receive when I am on NET?

Partner Update Letters:

There will be specific times during the year (see chart below) that you will write and send update letters to your supporters and partners. We encourage you to keep in contact with your partners as often as possible outside of these scheduled updates. Remember you are united in this cause of evangelisation and they want to hear what and how you are doing.



Newsletters:

NET Ministries Ireland produces a quarterly newsletter called **'Networks'**, which we will send to you supporters with your update letters.

**In the event a donor does not want newsletters or other letters, we respectfully comply with their wishes. Donors can opt out of receiving mailouts by marking it on their pledge card.

MONTHLY UPDATES:

Updating your mission partners EVERY MONTH is essential. When we invite mission partners to join the team we inform them that they are an integral part of the mission. We know that when our mission partners join our team either through a one time donation or monthly support, they are joining us for the year. IN order to do justice to the promise we make, it's important so send monthly updates to your mission partners. Initially this will take a few hours, but as you become familiar with the process, you will become more proficient at the process and have them sent out in no time.

Format Options:

There are multiple ways to update you mission partners about the impact of your ministry. Here are the two primary ways that we use:

1. **Email Update:** Using the emails you've collected, you can email your mission partners, sharing with the them the impact of their support
2. **Video Update:** Create a video which includes aspects of the ministry that you're doing and send it to your mission partners to give them a inside look on the ways that Jesus has been working through your ministry.

Update Resources:

1. **Mailchimp:** Find statistics for who received your emails, opens them, and how often they're opened.
2. **Canva:** Design a newsletter based on preset templates.
3. **Facebook:** Create a private Facebook for your mission partners, send them videos, words of encouragement and glory stories on the Facebook page.
4. **Youtube:** Upload videos and give your mission partners private access to the videos your up dates.

- Build an email list!
- People read in the shape of an "F" so design your newsletter as such.
- Make a powerful subject line
- Time your emails!
- Include a call to action ("Donate Here")

I am writing to you to share with you a very exciting ministry work I will be starting in August. I have been accepted to serve as a missionary with NET Ministries Ireland for a year! NET Ministries is a Catholic organisation that travels around Ireland facilitating retreats in parishes and schools sharing with others about what it means to follow Christ. NET stands for National Evangelisation Teams. Our mission is to encourage young people to love Jesus and embrace the life of the Church. Our team is absolutely stoked to see where this Lenten journey takes us all!





Deliciously deep-fried cheesy goodness...

Cheesy Fried Pickles (AKA Cheesy Frickles)

Ingredients:

Pickles
String cheese
1 Egg
A bit of milk
Vegetable oil
Flour
Breadcrumbs
Salt
Pepper
Cayenne pepper
Paprika

Directions:

Cover a plate with flour and add the seasonings. Crack the egg into a bowl with a bit of milk and whisk it together. Cover another plate with breadcrumbs and add seasonings.

Cut off both ends of the pickle, then with a straw, poke out the middle of the pickle. Feed the string cheese into the hole, and then roll the pickle in the flour, then the egg, then the breadcrumbs.

Heat oil on the stovetop up to about 190 degrees Celsius (375 degrees Fahrenheit) and gently put the pickles in the oil. Wait until they are golden brown, take them out of the oil, and enjoy with a dip of your choice!



We host 2 weekly broadcasts (one is suitable for families with young children) in which we share faith-building content, sing songs, and pray! We are kept busy with preparation for these broadcasts throughout the week. In addition, we are currently preparing to host the "Youth Alpha: Online" program to around 45 students starting in February! Although school is not fully in session for the time being, their studies continue online and teachers have allowed us to run this 10 week program with them.



What if I need materials?


If you would like materials for fundraising purposes, we can send electronic copies of newsletters and other promotional materials. You can request material from the NET office.
